COMMUNICATION FROM MAYOR AND ALDERMEN

Danny Bingham handed out the Profit & Loss Statement and the Statement of Expenditures.

Cassie Edrington of the MG Group briefly explained financials which included a loss in capital outlay, and a \$165k profit to \$1.2 million in Water/Sewer (Including Capacity Fees).

The library will be opening soon. Furniture is due the week of July 4.

Thanks to the Water/Sewer department for doing a good job recently.

DISCUSSION /AGREEMENT OF 31A PROJECT

Tommy Whaley & Cecelia Spivey represented MCPBU. They explained that the project to install water lines would be paid for in parts. Part A would be paid entirely by Marshall County. Part B would be split with Marshall County paying 60% and Chapel Hill paying 40%. Part C would be paid entirely by Chapel Hill. The river bore would be a 50/50 split. Attorney Todd Moore asked for assurance that the maximum cost for Chapel Hill would be \$1.8 million.

In the meantime, it was suggested that the town spray for mosquitoes in order to temporarily help resolve the issue.
