\*\*Neighbors expressed concerns about flooding in this area, and asked the BOMA to look into drainage solutions before allowing any more construction on this property.

#### **DISCUSSION**

Cory Proctor was present and spoke to the BOMA about his strong desire to move forward with the construction of the daycare. The main concern of the BOMA was still the traffic flow and the installation of a stop light. It was determined that Mr. Proctor would give Danny Bingham a written plan of action within the next few weeks. He also stated that he thought he could get a traffic study done by TDOT fairly quickly. BOMA can then decide if the daycare is feasible and affordable to the town.

Danny Bingham stated that the POST Office has requested permission from the town to install a monument sign on town property in the Northeast corner of the Town Hall lot. The sign will be approximately 6 feet high, but will not interfere with sightline of drivers. Todd Moore suggested that the BOMA vote on this request.

# APPROVE OR DENY THE POST OFFICE PUTTING AUP A 6-FOOT-TALL MONUMENT SIGN ON THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF THE TOWN HALL LOT, IN ORDER TO MAKE PEAOPLE AWARE OF THEIR NEW LOCATION. THE SIGN WILL BE WITHIN THE SPECIFICATIONS OF THE TOWN SIGN ORDINANCE, AND ALL COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH DIGGING, INSTALLATION, AND FINDING UTILITY LINES WILL BE THE REPOSIBILITY OF THE POST OFFICE.
