CITIZENS INPUT

• Stephen Brewer, owner of Chapel Hill Wine & Liquors, asked the Board if to consider capping the amount of liquor stores that can be opened in the town limits. He stated that the state recommends having one for every 3000 residents, and Chapel Hill already has 3 stores at its current population. The Board said they would consider his request and discuss it at their next Work Session.

COMMUNICATION FROM MAYOR AND ALDERMEN

- Mayor Faulkenberry stated that the Christmas Parade would be held Saturday, December 14 at 5:00 p.m. The town has got a Santa scheduled for the parade.
- Alderman Piper stated that the Board needs to see more statistics and daily report sheets from the Police Department and Fire Department. Without these reports, it is impossible for the Board to know exactly what the departments are doing on a daily basis. Alderman Sedlak asked if there was a way to get EMS reports from the county as well.

<u>REPORTS</u>

• Police and Fire Department reports were included in the packets, as were the monthly financial balances in the bank accounts. Phillip Dye informed the Board that the town had received the Debt Obligation paperwork from the loan that was recently refunded through Tennessee Municipal Bond Fund.

TOWN ADMINISTRATOR REPORT

Town Administrator Danny Bingham reported the following:

- He attended the PIO Crisis Symposium and got some good ideas.
- The new meter software update is done, and the billing software update should be done Friday, December 13.
- Smith Contractors will be pouring 520 yards of concrete for the new sewer plant over the next few weeks. The project is on schedule.
- Meals on Wheels is funded through the end of June. After that, the town must figure out a way to fund the project. Several ideas were thrown out, and will be discussed at the next Work Session.
- The Christmas Parade currently has over 40 entries.
- Town Hall Holiday Schedule: Open until noon on the 23rd, closed the 24th & 25th.
